The West Virginia Geological and Economic Survey (State Agency) is seeking to fill a full-time, permanent position for a senior-level geologist in its Oil and Gas Program.

The **Survey Geologist IV (or III)** will be expected to plan, organize, conduct, complete, or contribute to complex scientific research projects involving regional geology, geological or reservoir characterization, or sequestration studies, while also being involved in data development and responding to requests for information. The individual is expected to work closely with other geologists and Program personnel, while also pursuing independent advanced research. He/she must have effective verbal and written communication skills, be able to define and solve problems, and must accept responsibility for meeting deadlines.

Minimum qualifications for the position as a Survey Geologist IV include a Doctorate in Geology from an accredited college or university and three years of full-time or equivalent part-time paid professional experience as a geologist. Substitution: Master's Degree in Geology from an accredited college or university and six years of full-time or equivalent part-time paid experience as a professional geologist, or a Bachelor's Degree in Geology from an accredited four-year college or university and eight years of full-time or equivalent part-time paid experience as a professional geologist. Experience with computers and computer manipulation of data are desirable. A working knowledge of GIS software is expected. A Survey Geologist IV is a Pay Grade 17 of WV Division of Personnel.

Minimum qualifications for the position as a Survey Geologist III include a Doctorate in Geology from an accredited college or university. Substitution: Master's degree in Geology from an accredited college or university and three years of professional experience as a geologist, or a Bachelor's Degree in Geology from an accredited four-year college or university and five years of full-time or equivalent part-time paid experience as a professional geologist. Experience with computers and computer manipulation of data are desirable. A working knowledge of GIS software is expected. A Survey Geologist III is a Pay Grade 16 of WV Division of Personnel.
